



Outside with Hogarth - Get Creative!

Look at this picture of people playing a game.
Can you see what it is?



We can see a man has just thrown a ball to try and knock over some sticks.
These sticks are called **pins**.

How many do you see?
This game is called **Nine Pins** or **Skittles**.
The aim is to knock down all the pins

William Hogarth used to play this game in the garden at Hogarth's House when he lived there 300 years ago and we can still play it today!

Make your own pins by using objects from your recycling box.

Plastic bottles work really well. Remember, you need 9 so you might need to save up.

You can decorate your pins by painting them or sticking on colourful bits of paper. You could even make each one different!

Line up your pins like in the picture. Make sure there is nothing breakable behind them!

Stand back and roll (don't throw!) a ball towards the pins. How many can you knock over?

You can make it harder by asking an adult to add water to the bottles to make them heavier!
