William Hogarth was an artist who lived 300 years ago.
His art was inspired by the outside world.

Many artists of the time would use straight lines, but Hogarth liked to use curved S-shaped lines in his work.
He called this line the **line of beauty**.

He discovered it is often found in nature - for example in flowers like irises.
