



William Hogarth was born over 300 years ago in 1697 in London and went on to become a painter, printmaker and satirist (someone who uses humour to criticise society).

He became so well-known and successful that he became the Sergeant Painter to King George II. He is still famous today around the world and is remembered as the 'Father of British Painting'.



This is the house where he lived with his wife Jane and their pets.

When the Hogarths moved in, they decided they wanted more space so they built an extension which added more rooms and the detailed window you see in on the first floor, called the oriel window.

Look at the activity cards. In groups or individually, do the following:

2. Think of an obstacle the Hogarths might have faced to complete their extension. How do you think they overcame it?
