Life then and now

When William Hogarth wanted to make a copy of his paintings, he could either choose to paint it all over again or use a special technique called engraving to print it.

Discover printmaking

To make **prints** (copies of his work), Hogarth used sharp tools to draw his picture into a metal **plate**. These lines could then be filled with ink and pressed against a piece of paper. This printed the image he drew!
