1 Choose your background.

Are there lots of buildings?
What colours are they?
How many windows?

2 Build up your background.

Look out for things in your street.
Are there trees?
Is there a letter box?

3 Start filling your street.

Look out for vehicles.
Are there lots of cars and lorries?
Are there cyclists?

4 Add the people.

Who do you see?
What are they wearing?
Do they look happy? Afraid? Sad?

5 Complete with details

Are there any finishing touches?
How might you include the sounds
and smells of the street?
